ONE-HUNDRED HOUR COURSE

A Law Enforcement Pre-Service course is offered at UMFK, in partnership with the Maine Criminal Justice Academy. UMFK has developed a 3 credit hour course that meets all requirements of the Academy's LEPS course. This program is required by the State of Maine as the minimum level of training for any part-time law enforcement officer. It is intended to provide training and instruction to properly prepare persons for tasks that are performed by local law enforcement personnel. Students who successfully complete this course will receive a certificate from the Academy. This UMFK course is offered in two formats. A training session lasting thirteen days, consisting of all day classes, is offered every summer at the UMFK campus. In an exclusive agreement with Academy, an Interactive Television (ITV) format, is offered every fall semester, and is available throughout the state of Maine.
