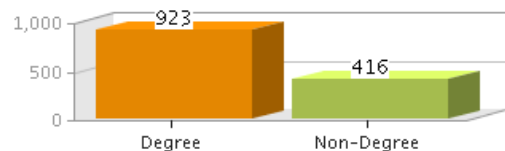

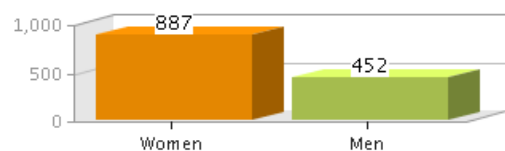

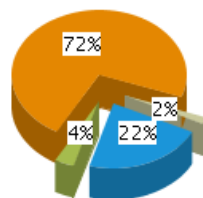

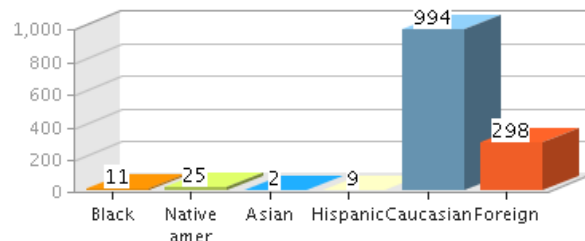

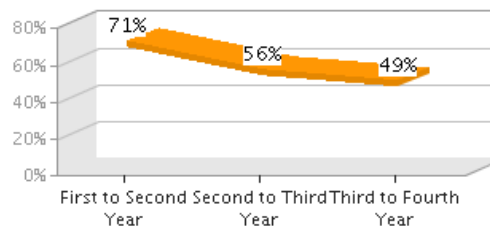

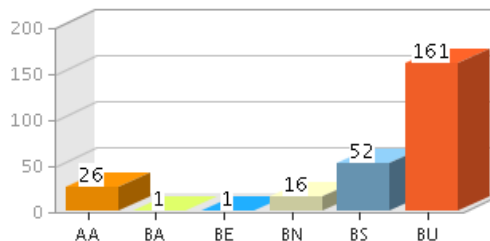

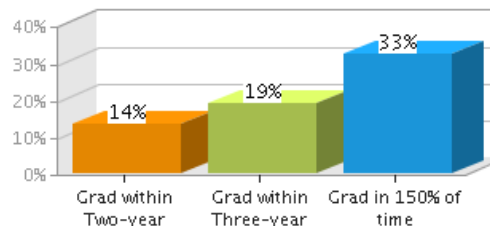
Retention Rates - New First Time (5 years average)



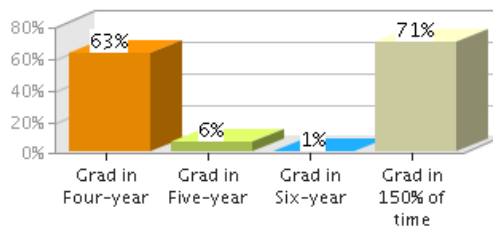
Most Recent Graduates



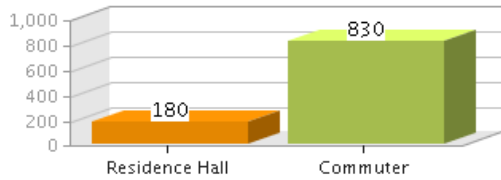
Graduation Rates - 2 years (5 years average)



Graduation Rates - 4 years (5 years average)

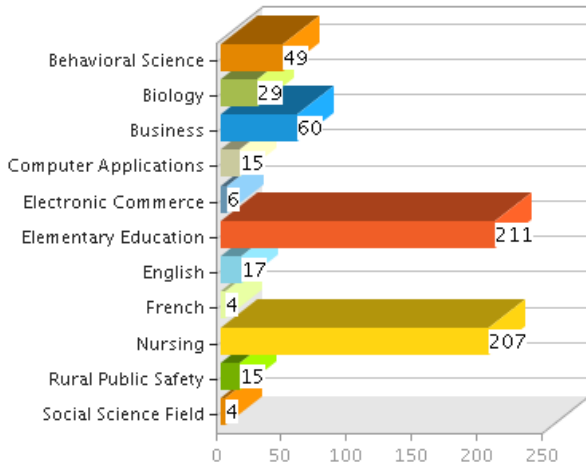
